



The General Federation of Women's Clubs of Connecticut (GFWC/CT) is proud to support the American Mural Project (AMP) AMP will create the single largest piece of indoor collaborative artwork in the country. The mural is a mixed media painting and relief sculpture that will measure 5 stories high and 120 feet long. Over 10,000 people have worked on the project so far; children and adults. The mural will be located in a mill in Winsted, CT. The artist Ellen Griesedieck conceived the project to pay tribute to the American worker. Thousands of artists, scientists, teachers, and children from coast to coast have contributed to its creation as well as recognized artisans such as Gee's Bend quilters of Alabama and scientists from the Mars Explorer Rover Mission. GFWC/CT will be hosting a fundraiser in Hartford on November 13th. The project will be on display in the Hartford Public Library from October 16th to November 18th.
