

Discussing a book with the author is a rare experience to gain more insight about the book, to learn about various inspirations, and to hear about what the author may be working on next.


The Essay by Robin Yocum can be purchased on many online sites. You are encouraged to complete the reading prior to the book review.

A Library's History - Bangor, Pennsylvania

The Bangor Public Library was founded in 1921 by the Women's Club, after years of fundraising, the library finally opened to serve Bangor and the surrounding communities. The building was built in 1890 as the home of the Merchants National Bank of Bangor. The cost of the original building was \$6,400. In 1939 Robert Steinmetz gave the building to the Borough of Bangor to be used as a public library and as the home of the Bangor Women's Club. Due to lack of space the Women's Club no longer meets in the building.

Robert Steinmetz's wife Pearl was a member of the Bangor Women's Club . The Women's Club is a supporter of the Bangor Public Library. The Club also donates a book to the library in remembrance of deceased club women.

The mission of the library is to provide free, high-quality information, resources, and services for all citizens residing in the Bangor Area School District and surrounding areas.

As part of that mission, the Bangor Public Library seeks to promote life-long literacy, learning, and personal enrichment by offering materials and a wide range of services in many formats. The library remains a cultural focus of the community.
