

Our committee is planning two projects for October.

Friday Oct 6 from 3:30pm to 5:00pm I will be in front of the library to collect cat food and supplies for the Greater New Haven Cat Project. Supplies needed are dry and wet cat food (they usually buy cat food from Walmart as they seem to have the best prices), bleach (needed to clean floors etc.), laundry detergent, dish washing liquid, sponges and paper towels. They do not need rags, towels, or washcloths as they have plenty of them. They buy their kitty litter at the Tractor Supply Company (there is one in Wallingford on North Colony Road). They do not usually buy from the pet stores as their prices are usually high. OdoBan disinfectant and deodorizer is needed to clean cages as it does not harm the metal as bleach does. The only place they have been able to find it is at Home Depot. If you would like to donate and are unable to make the collection call Linda 203 387-2990.

The second project is the Trunk and Treat for The Children's Center of Hamden on Whitney Avenue. It will be from 4:45pm to 6:00pm on Thursday Oct. 26.

They are expecting 100 Children.

If you are interested in donating treats, please bring your donations to the meeting on Oct. 4. The Children's Center asks that the candy be individually wrapped and peanut nut and tree nut free (no Reece's or nut butters). If you would like to donate and cannot make the meeting call Linda at 203 387-2990 and I will pick it up. Remember to keep adding "open-minded", maybe some "humor" and "comradery" as needed to each part. Mix all parts together and add a little follow-through. Share the news about your successful dish and ask everyone to come try it and contribute! Save your lessons learned and successes for the next time. Don't forget to thank all your cooks and those you came to try it out!

Pumpkin Squares

4 eggs

1 cup oil

2 cups flour

1 Teaspoon baking soda

1/2 Teaspoon ginger

3/4 Teaspoon salt

2 cups sugar

1 can solid pumpkin (15 oz)

2 Teaspoons baking powder

2 Teaspoons cinnamon

1/2 Teaspoon cloves

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, grease a 15x9 cookie sheet

Beat eggs, sugar, oil and pumpkin. Stir in sifted dry ingredients

Pour batter into the prepared cookie sheet.

Bake 25 minutes or until toothpick comes out dry

Frosting:

3 ounces of cream cheese, softened

1/4 cup + 2 tablespoons softened butter

1 Teaspoon vanilla 2 Cups powdered sugar

1/2 Cup chopped walnuts (optional)

Beat cream cheese and butter until smooth. Add vanilla and powdered sugar and beat until smooth.

Frost squares and sprinkle with chopped nuts.

Refrigerate prior to cutting into squares.

Yield: 28 - 2" squares.

This recipe was given to me by one of our great bakers from the HWC many years ago, Marge Giunti.
